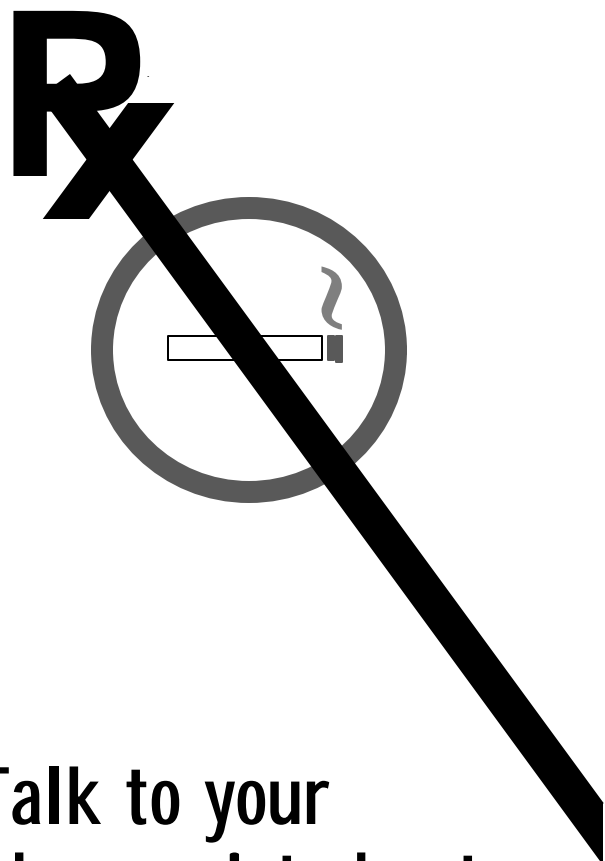

Tobacco use can alter the way your body responds to certain medications. Tobacco contains substances which can cause enzymes in the liver to make drugs less effective. If you use tobacco you may have a

reduced effect from these medications. If you are a tobacco user, tell your pharmacist and physician so they can educate you about possible drug interactions with tobacco.
